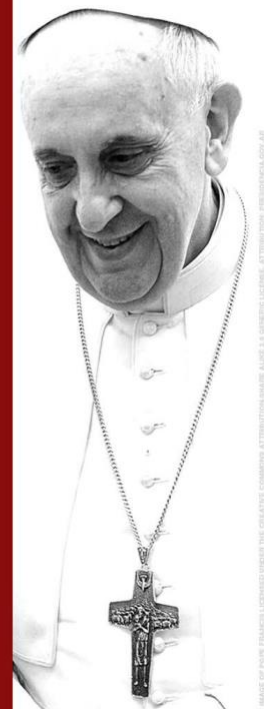

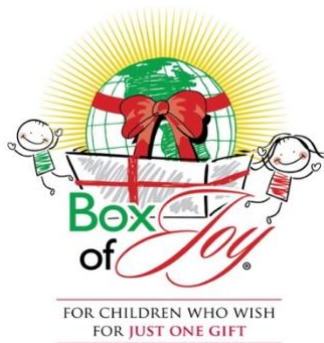
Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

3-5-year-old children are invited to participate in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) on Mondays from 9:00-10:00 AM in the atrium at the parish center. CGS is a common religious experience in which the religious values of childhood, primarily those values of contemplation and enjoyment of God, are predominant. This experience is shared in a place prepared for the religious life of children called the Atrium. Atrium sessions start September 12 and run most Mondays through April. Please include a Christmas card with a message for the child who receives your gift. Cards are available beside the baskets. Monetary donations can be dropped in the collection basket in an envelope labeled "Box of Joy". Collection will continue through September 18th.

Students, teachers, and parents were all smiles as the new school year began on Wednesday. It was a great first week of teaching, learning, and being together! Below are some happy first and second graders.

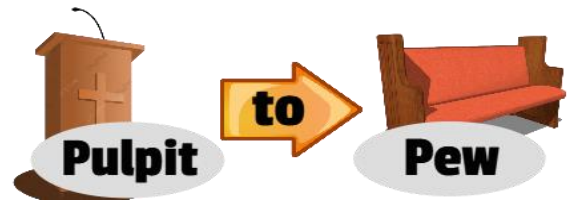


Serve God's Children
