



End of the World

This week's readings make us think about the end of the world. In the first reading, we are told that the day of the Lord is coming. The psalm assures us that "The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice." In the second reading, Paul asks that we diligently work for the good of all. In the gospel, Jesus speaks about the end times and perseverance.

Jesus tells us that the end is coming. And when it does, we will be judged. There are some criteria for this judgement in the gospels. Did I treat others with compassion? Did I spread the Good News?

The gospel calls us to give testimony. This will not be easy and will bring trials and suffering from worldly powers. In fact, we don't need to wait for the end times to experience this. Even today, being a disciple of Jesus Christ is often met with scorn and ridicule. So, while none of us wants to suffer, and we certainly shouldn't seek out persecution, we will experience pain in our lives. Some of this pain will be a result of living our faith. This is our mission as Christians. But Jesus assures us that we will be saved, so we take hope in that.

Ask yourself:

How am I testifying to the Good News of Jesus Christ?
Have I ever suffered as a result of being a Christian?
How has God rescued me when I have been in distress?
