# The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe



The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly referred to as the **Feast of Christ the King**, is a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar, instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI, it is celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary time and thus the end of the liturgical year.

The readings for the Solemnity of Christ the King focus on the kingship of Jesus Christ, who is not a king like the rulers of this world. In the first reading, David is anointed the king of Israel. In the second reading, Paul tells us that we are going to share in the inheritance of Jesus Christ. In the gospel, from the cross, Jesus tells the good thief that he will join him in paradise.

Jesus wasn't the king they were expecting. The Messiah was supposed to free God's people from the oppressive foreigners who came into the Promised Land and controlled them. But Jesus was not a military commander. He did not incite rebellion against the Romans. Instead, he preached about love of God and others.

Jesus is our king. He frees us from fear and death. In his kingdom, we care for each other, especially the weak, the outcast, the sick, the despised, the sinners. He shows us how to trust in the Father, which is the only way we can be truly free. He shows us that love requires sacrifice, and that the sacrifice is worth it. He is the revelation of divine love.

How have love and sacrifice intersected in my life?

# **Featured Saint** **Fearless German Priest**

**Blessed Bernard Lichtenberg**  
**(1875-1943)**

Father Lichtenberg was appointed canon of St. Hedwig's Cathedral in Berlin, Germany, in 1932, as the Nazis began their rise to power in Europe. He was outspoken against Hitler's regime and the persecution of the sick, mentally ill, and the deportation of waves of Jewish people to appalling concentration camps. From the pulpit, he continually condemned Nazi dogma and the inhumane treatment of people. He ended every Mass by praying for persecuted Jews. Disregarding advice from friends that he was placing himself in danger, Fr. Lichtenberg was eventually arrested and imprisoned in a Berlin prison for two years. He then asked to be sent to the Jewish ghetto at Lodz, Poland, but was sent instead to the Dachau concentration camp. Both physically and mentally exhausted from his maltreatment while in prison, Fr. Lichtenberg died in a cattle car on his way to the camp. He was beatified by the Church in 1996, and in 2004 was declared **Righteous Among the Nations**, an honor bestowed by the State of Israel upon non-Jews who risked or gave their lives to protect and save Jews from extermination by the Holocaust.
