## Cemetery Regulations Part 3

To avoid misunderstandings, it has been suggested that we publish the regulations governing our cemeteries. This is the third part:

### INTERMENTS

1. All interments must be in accord with Church Law. No symbols or ceremonies, religious or otherwise, may be used or performed that would be against Christian principles.
2. The sacred ground of a Catholic cemetery is intended for Catholic burial only. We have the right to refuse burial to those who are not practicing Catholics. The Church explicitly permits non-Catholics to be buried with their spouses.
3. No graves may be opened for interment of corporal remains or cremains without permission from the parish office.
4. Holy Spirit Parish may refuse to open a grave or permit the placement of a memorial when:
  1. just debts are not paid [e.g., unpaid balance on a plot, annual plot care, or perpetual care];
  2. or when there is a question of ownership of the plot.

In the Passion narratives, the Sanhedrin was the "supreme court" of the Jewish people, with competence in religious and security matters, including the power of arrest. Consisting of 71 members, hailing from the Jewish elders, scribes, and high priests, the Sanhedrin was solely responsible for the trial, conviction, and judgment of Jesus on the charge of "blasphemy" or desecration of God's name, resulting in the punishment of death by crucifixion.

While **St. Patrick** is perhaps the most well-known Irish saint, he is not the only one.

**Among Ireland's saints are:**

**St. Aidan** - Founded a monastery that became a learning center of Celtic Christianity for Northern Ireland.

**St. Brigid** - Daughter of a slave and chieftain, she founded the first convent for women in Ireland. She is the patron of Irish women.

**St. Columban** - Supposedly Columban was so handsome that he was advised that if he truly wanted to live an ascetic life, he would have to go to a region where women were less seductive, someplace like Ireland.

**St. Columbkille** - Credited with bringing the Catholic faith to Scotland.

**St. Kieran** - Called one of Ireland's 12 apostles, he founded one of Ireland's first monasteries.
