Cemetery Regulations Part 5

To avoid misunderstandings, it has been suggested that we publish the regulations governing our cemeteries. This is the fifth part:

VISITORS RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. This cemetery is private property. The cemetery is always closed from dusk to dawn.*
- 2. When there are hazardous winter conditions, St. Mary Cemetery will be closed for the safety of visitors.*
- 3. All persons entering the cemetery for whatever reason must display proper respect for the deceased and for the sacred ground in which they are interred. Holy Spirit Parish reserves the right to take such measures as the circumstances warrant in order to ensure strict observance of this basic principle.*
- 4. There is to be no loitering or unlawful assembly, no boisterous language or inappropriate actions, no alcohol or controlled substances in the cemetery.*
- 5. No firearms may be brought on to the property or discharged without permission of Holy Spirit Parish. Hunting on cemetery property, littering, and vandalism are punishable by a fine and/or imprisonment. Violators will be prosecuted.*
- 6. All off-highway vehicles, including bikes, skateboards, roller blades, snowmobiles, etc. are prohibited in the cemetery. No illegal parking of cars is permitted. The speed limit in the cemetery is 15 mph.*
- 7. Identification may be required of visitors by cemetery personnel; in extreme cases, a Burial Privilege Certificate may be required of the visitor.*
- 8. Unless otherwise specified in the Cemetery's Rules and Regulations, children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a parent or other adult. Only trained seeing-eye dogs are permitted on cemetery grounds.*

The Most Powerful Occurrence

Christ's Passion did not end when he breathed his last on the cross, rather it continued on until he burst forth from the grave on the first Easter Sunday.

The Easter Vigil readings and prayers demonstrate that man was not fully redeemed until Jesus threw off the shackles of death, affording us the opportunity to someday unite with him in heaven. Ironically, the Roman soldiers guarding the grave site would have been the first to see the powering glow of the Resurrection.

Since the Roman penalty for soldiers being asleep while on guard was immediate execution, it is totally inconceivable that any or all of the guards were dozing when Jesus exited the tomb. They witnessed the most powerful occurrence in the history of mankind.
