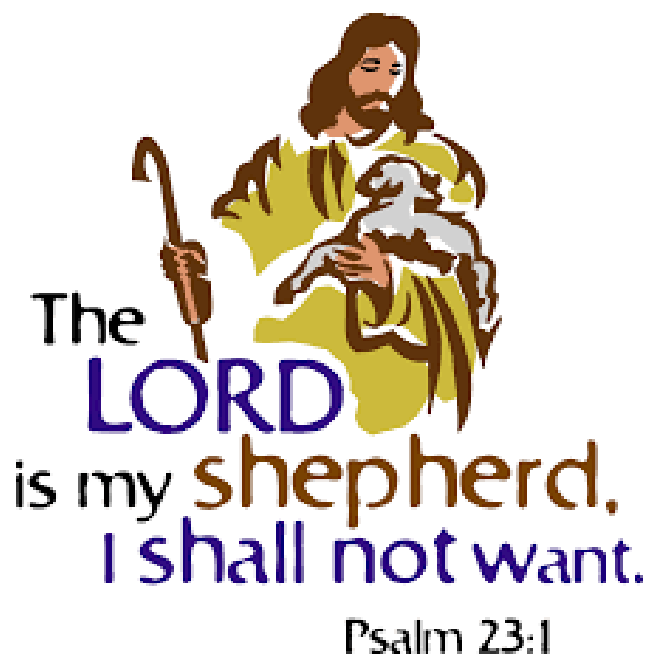

Featured Saint

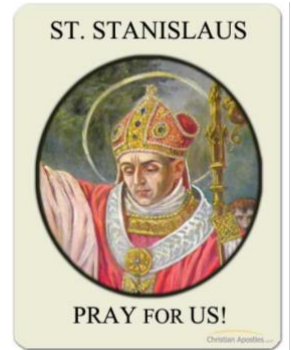
St. Stanislaus (1030-1079)

Country - Poland

Named the bishop of Krakow, Poland, in 1072, Stanislaus was the only Polish bishop of the day with the courage to stand up to the tyrannical king Boleslaus II and denounce his cruelty and abuse of power.

Upon being excommunicated by Stanislaus, King Boleslaus was so enraged that he ordered his guards to kill Stanislaus. When the guards refused the order, Boleslaus drew his own sword and murdered Stanislaus while he was saying Mass in the cathedral. Stanislaus is revered in Polish Catholic history, but never more so than in 1979, the 900th anniversary of his martyrdom, when Polish-born Pope John Paul II, on his first return to his homeland as Pope, celebrated Mass in the location where Stanislaus had previously served as archbishop.
