## Catechism

"Catechism" is the name given to a written work that contains a summary of all the beliefs of the faith. Until the second half of the 20th century, for millions of Catholics in the United States the word catechism meant the **Baltimore Catechism**, which originated at the Council of Baltimore in 1884 when American bishops decided to publish a national catechism. The **Baltimore Catechism** contained 421 questions and answers in 37 chapters and gave meaning and understanding of the Catholic faith to millions of American Catholics right up to the dawn of the Second Vatican Council. At that time, Pope John XXIII urged for a more effective doctrine of faith in the contemporary world. Consequently, in 1985, a synod of Bishops in Rome convened, proposed, and accepted a universal catechism for the Catholic Church, simply named the **Catechism of the Catholic Church**. First published in 1992, the Catechism of the Catholic Church is the standard document of Catholic doctrine in today's world and is arranged around four sections: *Profession of Faith, Christian Mystery, Life in Christ, Christian Prayer*.
