## Military Chaplains

All branches of the U.S. military have ordained clergy, commissioned officers and enlisted personnel from all faiths and creeds, who provide ongoing spiritual and emotional care to troops and their families. Chaplains may be found both at a base or in the fields of battle. They go wherever the soldiers go. Since the Civil War, 419 chaplains of all religious faiths have died in the line of duty, either on the field of battle, a military hospital, or in a POW camp. The first chaplain to die in action was Emmeran Bliemel, a Catholic priest serving Tennessee soldiers in the Civil War, killed under fire in August 1864 while giving final absolution to a dying Confederate colonel at the Battle of Jonesboro, Georgia. Over the years, nine chaplains have been awarded the nation's highest military recognition, the Medal of Honor. Five of the nine were Catholic priests.

The Tuscan, Italy, born Pope John I was elderly and in poor health when he was named Pope in 523. During his pontificate, he was caught up in a violent dispute between the Roman Emperor Justin and King Theodoric the

Great of Italy. Suspecting that Pope John I was conspiring with the emperor on matters of orthodoxy, Theodoric had Pope John arrested and imprisoned in a Rome prison. Pope John died in the prison and is buried in the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome.
